

MELANOMA IN AUSTRALIA FACTS

- Australia has the ignominious distinction of having the world's highest rate of skin cancer and those who live on beaches are even at greater risk.
- While the overwhelming majority of melanomas are diagnosed at an early stage and early stage diagnosis has above 90% survival rate; the survival rate for advanced melanomas is still only 10 per cent. Today one Aussie dies every five hours from melanoma and the incidence is on the rise. There has also been an increase in melanoma deaths in the past four years from 1467 in 2014 to 1905 in 2018.
- However promising new treatments are on the horizon with immunotherapy recently doubling survival rates in late stage melanoma patients.
- In December 2017 another new study in mice found that combining the drugs Selumetinib with the immunosuppresive drug approved for rheumatoid arthritis (leflunomide), completedly halted the tumour over a 12 day period. This far outstipped the effect of either drug used in isolation, the research reported in Oncotarget found.
